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



Who is Tweeting the war using ancient texts? : Findings

- Primarily private individuals who show some identifying information (n:144)
- > Unidentifiable private individuals (n: 27) and organisations (n: 28)
- Public figures (n:10)
- > Occupation: primarily unknown

➢ Where information is shared, mostly a) academics from various areas (e.g., psychology, European studies, science and technology, politics and international relations) b) people engaged with politics in range of capacities (e.g., political consultants, politicians, diplomats)

Who is Tweeting the war using ancient texts?: Political affiliation

- Political affiliation tends not to be shared, but where it is, those affiliated with the left and right appear evenly represented (left n:23, right n:24)
- The same themes appear across political positions e.g.,
 - Zelenskyy as King Leonidas
 - Ukrainian soldiers as the 300

Examples:

•#Zelenskyy represents the spirit of King Leonidas I #putin is more cowardly than Xerces I #Ukraine is our modern #Sparta #Russia is just an incompetent has been too much of a coward to kill its crazy leader (left leaning)

•Volodymyr Zelensky will be forever compared to the King Leonidas of Sparta no matter how this ends. #BidensWar #Ukraine #SpartanUp #Zelensky (right leaning)

Who is Tweeting the war using ancient texts?: Other observations

• Reference to other historical battles e.g.,

- #Ukraine: the "last stand" at #Mariupol will resonate through history just as the #Spartans at Thermopylae, just as the #Texans at the Alamo. Such heroism and the perpetual struggle for freedom. #Russia - you will forever be in a state of shame. We stand with Ukraine – always
- Not all battles yield victory, but some few inspire us still. Thermopylae. The Alamo. Wizna. The Chasseurs Ardennais. The Battle of Britain. And now #Mariupol. Whether the defenders hold out, the men and women of #Ukraine and #TheWest should be in awe of their sacrifices!

Links with other research

- Of the politically affiliated accounts, most perpetuate the same narrative (e.g., Ukrainian soldiers as brave heroes, Russia as bully), aside from one, where there appears to be an orientation to a dominant Russian disinformation narrative:
- Thucydides trap. And the western world is trying to bring Russia to it's knees. It is another attempt at regime change like, Iraq, Afghanistan, Syria. The US and Europe want to fight Russia to the last Ukranian.
