

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

History of the Peloponnesian War (431 – 404 BCE)

War among the Greeks
Athens (naval empire and democracy)
Sparta (oligarchy, introvert)

Ended in Athens' defeat

Speeches ( & narrative) – general feature of ancient historians


# Thucydides c. 460s-400 BCE



Father of 'scientific' history (methodology)


### Foundational / influential:

- political philosophy (Thomas Hobbes' translation, 1629)
- historical science / positivism
   'before him I kneel' Leopold von Ranke
   'the immortal Thucydides' Barthold Georg Niebuhr
- political realism / IR (Melian Dialogue, 5.85–116)
- Funeral Oration 2.35-46 Pericles / democracy (*Gettysburg Address*, Lincoln)








'Thucydides Trap' (2017)








Herodotus, c.480s-420s

Histories

'Father of history' (Cicero)
Graeco-Persian Wars (490-479 BCE) – key theme
Ethnic stereotyping:
Greeks/West vs. Persians/East/'barbarians'

The first ethnographer – Scythia (Ukraine)
Story- teller (myth, gods/religious explanations)




The 300, Zack Snyder film, 2006 (inspired by Miller's comic 1998)














# Herodotus, c.480s-420s



Battles
Marathon (490 BCE) – unexpected Greek victory (Hdt. 6.94-120)

the liberation of the #Kharkiv district of #Ukraine will be celebrated on the same day as the battle of #Marathon. the Greeks shattered the idea of the invincible Persian army, the #Ukrainian army put the "second-strongest army of the world" where it belongs: into the trash.

They [the Athenians] were the first Greeks known to charge enemy forces at a run, and the first to endure the sight of Persian dress and the men wearing it (Herodotus 6.112.3)


Battles – symbols, memory
Thermopylae (480 BCE) – Greek defeat, Hdt. 7.175-233
Plataea (479 BCE) – Greek victory, Hdt. 9.58-75
